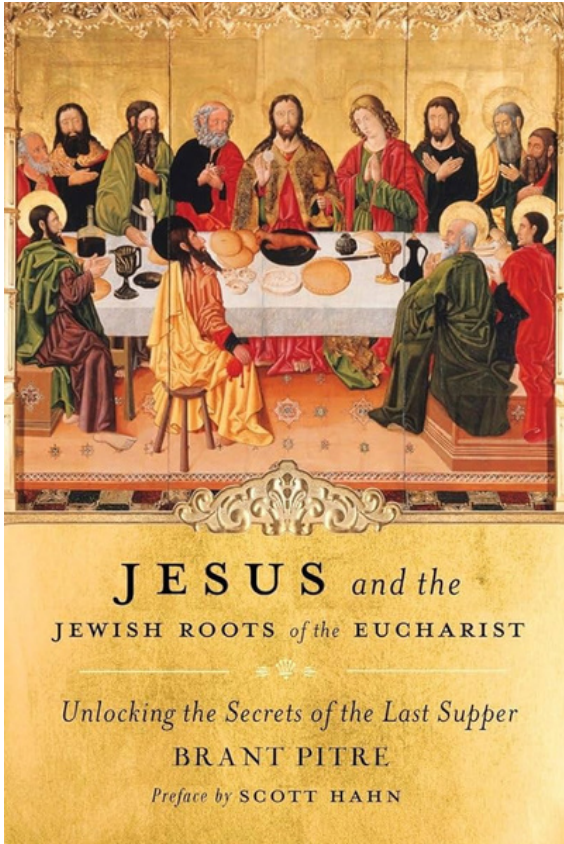


Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist: Unlocking the Secrets of the Last Supper
